#### **Fiction**

- 1. Love and Summer-by William Trevor
  - a. Ellie is forced to choose between an uncertain future with the man she loves and the unfulfilled life she has with her husband.
- 2. A Death in Summer-by Benjamin Black
  - a. Doctor Quirke and Inspector Hackett soon realize that Richard Jewell's death is not suicide, but murder. (Part of the Quirke Dublin mystery series)
- 3. Last Summer in Arcadia-by Deirdre Purcell
  - a. Three couples have everything to lose: their marriages, their family lives, and their friendships after last summer when they all traveled to the south of France.

### Non-Fiction

Cooking: Maybe this summer you'd like to learn how to make an Irish dish-the library has cookbooks with a variety of recipes to bring out your inner chef, including:

- 1. Real Irish Food-150 classic recipes from the old country-by David Bowers
- 2. Irish Cooking-more than 75 delicious recipes from pub fare to country classics
- 3. Elegant Irish Cooking-recipes from the world's foremost Irish chefs-by Noel C. Cullen

Music: Or maybe you're interested in Irish music-the library also has a collection of music books for you to start your band, including:

- 1. Celtic Music-A Complete Guide-by June Skinner Sawyers
- 2. The Music, Songs and Instruments of Ireland-by Karen Farrington
- 3. The Irish Fiddle Book-The art of traditional fiddle-playing-by Matt Cranitch

Every summer the library celebrates Bloomsday, the celebration of Irish writer James Joyce's life. June 16th is the day his novel Ulysses takes place in 1904, named after its protagonist Leopold Bloom.

Bloomsday is celebrated by fans of Joyce and literature across the world with readings, performances, music and more to commemorate a single day in Leopold Bloom's life in Dublin.
