Now that the library's back open [on September 5th, 2023], let's see what programs will be offered.

#### [Film Series]

Beginning in September the McClelland Library will show two movies featuring vastly different accounts of the Irish-American immigration experience in the 19th century. The first film will be "Far and "Away," starring Tom Cruise and Nicole Kidman, in which Irish immigrants build a new life in a land of opportunity. This film will be shown on Friday, September 8 [2023] from 5:30 to 9:00 at night.

"Gangs of New York," starring Daniel Day Lewis and Leonardo DiCaprio, is the second film that will be viewed on Friday, September 29, 2023 from 5:00 to 9:00 at night. In this highly nominated film, a much grittier and more violent portrayal of the Irish immigration experience is pictured in Manhattan's legendary Five Points neighborhood.

Following each film, speakers will engage in a discussion of the diaspora experience presented by each-guests are invited to join the discussion or simply listen. After "Gangs of New York" the discussion will include a comparison of both films.

On September 30 [2023]: "Milkman" by Anna Burns is the book that will be discussed. And then October 28 [2023]: "Haven" by Emma Donoghue.

And finally on December 2 [2023]: "My Father's House" by Joseph O'Connor

## [Baby Time]

Beginning in January, the McClelland Library will be launching a new program for little ones! Shamrocks Sprouts Babytime is an infant lap-sit program for children ages 0-24 months along with a caregiver. During Babytime we read aloud and lead adult-child pairs in activities. Research indicates the importance of the adult-child bond in building early literacy. Babytime also supports early literacy by increasing vocabulary and text awareness

by sharing age-appropriate stories in an atmosphere of fun, engaging activity. The program typically runs about 20 minutes to accommodate a baby's attention span, and is followed by time to play and socialize. We are excited to bring this program to our community!
